

Medetomidine



Medetomidine is a veterinary tranquilizer **similar to xylazine (tranq) but much stronger.**

Unlike xylazine, medetomidine use **has not been associated with wounds.**

Medetomidine **can cause deep sleepiness, a slow heart rate, low blood pressure, very low or no pulse, hallucinations.**

Medetomidine **withdrawal can cause severe and harmful high blood pressure.**

Medetomidine is **currently found in 3 of every 4 fentanyl samples** checked by Toronto's Drug Checking Service. We should **assume medetomidine is just as common in our fentanyl supply.**

Use naloxone if you think someone is overdosing; medetomidine is almost always found with fentanyl.
