## HARVESTING DATES 2022-2023 MOOSE

#### **INSIDE ALGONQUIN PARK:**

Moose harvesting <u>inside</u> Algonquin Park shall begin October 7, 2023

- ◆ Cow moose harvesting <u>inside</u> Algonquin Park shall remain open until December 21, 2023 or until the target limit has been achieved.
- ◆ **Bull** moose harvesting <u>inside</u> Algonquin Park shall remain open until **January 15, 2024** or until the target limit has been achieved.
- ◆ Calf moose harvesting <u>inside</u> Algonquin Park shall remain open until **January 15, 2024** or until the target limit has been achieved.

### **OUTSIDE ALGONQUIN PARK:**

Moose harvesting <u>outside</u> Algonquin Park shall begin <u>October 11</u>, <u>2023</u>

- ◆ Cow moose harvesting <u>outside</u> Algonquin Park shall remain open until <u>December 21, 2023</u> or until the target limit has been achieved.
- ◆ Bull moose harvesting <u>outside</u> Algonquin Park shall remain open until <u>January 15, 2024</u> or until the target limit has been achieved.
- ◆ Calf moose harvesting <u>outside</u> Algonquin Park shall remain open until **January 15, 2024** or until the target limit has been achieved.

### **DEER**

- ◆ Deer harvesting <u>inside</u> Algonquin Park shall begin October 7, 2023 and remain open until January 15, 2024
- ◆ Deer harvesting <u>outside</u> Algonquin Park shall begin September 1, 2023 and remain open until January 15, 2024
- ◆ Deer in WMU 41 outside Algonquin Park shall end earlier on December 15, 2023

### **ELK**

• Elk harvesting <u>outside</u> Algonquin Park shall begin September 1, 2023 and will close on December 21, 2023 or until the target limit has been achieved.



# **CODE OF CONDUCT**

The following guidelines are designed to assist you in avoiding the possibility of confrontation with MNR Officers while you exercise your right to harvest.

- Algonquin Harvesters should be sure to carry their status cards at all times when harvesting.
- ◆ No Algonquin shall refuse to stop their vehicle(s) when signaled to do so, either by means of hand signals or lights, by a monitor of the Harvest Department or by an officer of the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR)
- To harvest a moose, you must be in a hunting group with an Algonquin person who has an adult or calf tag issued by the Algonquin Harvest Department.
- The moose tag must be attached to the harvested moose before transporting it. (i.e. the nose or hind leg).
- Any member of your hunt group and/or moose tag holder must be present when transporting the harvest.
- Report immediately of any harvest, you must notify the Harvest Department by phone, in person, email, etc.

- No Algonquin shall have a loaded firearm in a motor vehicle, or shoot from a vehicle or power boat, without a special permit.
- No Algonquin shall harvest, or attempt to harvest, while under the influence of alcohol or any intoxicant, narcotic or drugs.
- During an open season for moose or deer, no Algonquin shall possess a loaded firearm on a paved roadway or the right-of-way of a paved road.
- No Algonquin, who has taken any wild game suitable for food, shall allow the flesh to be destroyed or spoiled.
- No Algonquin shall willfully mutilate, deface, destroy or tamper with any sign or poster erected, maintained, or posted, for the purpose of giving notice to the public of private property or restricted hunting or fishing.

- No Algonquin shall shoot a deer or moose while it is swimming.
- ◆ Do not litter or leave garbage behind. Bring out what you take in. Leave no trace
- Harvesting under the Algonquin Law does not allow a non-native or a non - Algonquin person to hunt with you. If you hunt with a non-native or non - Algonquin person you must have a provincial hunting licenses and obey provincial regulations.
