
Dam Construction

DANGER



Higher than usual water flow at the dam in Pikwakanagan

Construction has begun at the dam in Pikwakanagan. In order to complete repairs to the dam, water flow must be diverted from the side opposite Pikwakanagan resulting in water flowing at a rate much higher than the seasonal norm, on the Pikwakanagan side of the dam. Do not approach the river's edge 150 M below or above the dam at this time.



Community Safety

WE HEAR YOU!

The Chief and Council want you to know that we share our members concerns about community safety in Pikwakanagan and we have been working on developing a plan of action. An internal working group is now in place to: further evaluate all concerns; determine funding needs and availability; then set a plan for action. Key to that action plan will be Community input and active involvement. The Chief and Council are committed to addressing the need for a safe and healthy community and membership. Watch for further communications and invitations for your involvement as this is a community issue that needs your input, action, and support.

Treaty Negotiations

We want to assure you that we are working very hard on making sure that the treaty negotiations are being conducted in the way that you have told the Chief and Council that you want the talks to proceed.

We have reviewed all the information provided to the Chief and Council by our membership over the years, including the feedback from the Treaty Pause of 2021, and we have met with the ANRs of AOO to discuss how we can move forward.

We have also met with Canada and Ontario negotiators, and we hope to be back to the main negotiation table soon under a new structure that will ensure that we get the best treaty possible for Pikwakanagan.

Part of the direction that was given by you, the membership of Pikwakanagan, is that Pikwakanagan should have our own lawyer in the Treaty Negotiations. We are happy to announce that we have secured the services of Mr. Bruce McIvor, a lawyer and partner with First Peoples Law, to be our lawyer in the treaty negotiations.

We will be providing further updates as things progress!

Chief and Council Update: Summary of the AOO Tribunal Decisions

This is a summary of the AOO Tribunal decisions now that they've completed their work.

There were 15 disputed ancestors, including a pair who were a father-son duo and another pair who were a married couple.

Overall, the Tribunal ordered that 8 of the 15 disputed ancestors be removed from the Schedule of Ancestors. As you can see in the chart below, the Tribunal followed AOFN's recommendations 100% of the time.

The Tribunal's decisions will have a substantial impact on the number of Algonquin beneficiaries and will result in many people being removed from the Algonquin Enrolment List (Exact # TBD). The Enrolment Officer will be reviewing the list in the coming days according to the Tribunal decisions.

Health Information



Should I be worried about blastomycosis?



What is it?

Blastomycosis is an infection caused by breathing in spores of the soil fungus Blastomyces, and usually begins as a lung infection. It is not spread from person-to-person or from dogs to people. Signs of illness usually take up to three months to develop.

Where is it found?

Blastomyces is found across Ontario, with the highest rate of infection in the north. It grows in moist areas, often close to bodies of water such as lakes. The spores can be breathed in when soil or organic matter (such as leaf and wood piles) containing the fungus is disturbed or moved.

How will I know if I have blastomycosis?

Symptoms of blastomycosis include:

- A cough that won't go away
- Difficulty breathing
- Chest pain

- Fever or night sweats
- Unexplained weight loss
- Extreme fatigue

Blastomycosis is treatable. Mild blastomycosis can often be treated at home. However, if left untreated, the infection can become more severe, require hospitalization or even cause death. About half of people who become infected have no signs of illness and do not need treatment to recover.

What should I do if I have symptoms?

The symptoms of blastomycosis may be confused with other health conditions. If you have any of the symptoms that are listed, even if you have had them for a while, please see a health care provider as soon as possible and let them know that you are worried about blastomycosis.

Early diagnosis and treatment is the best way to prevent serious harm or death.


On the passing of your law on Saturday, March 25, 2023. The law will come into effect on April 2024.
