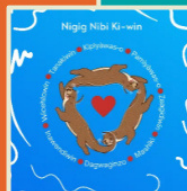

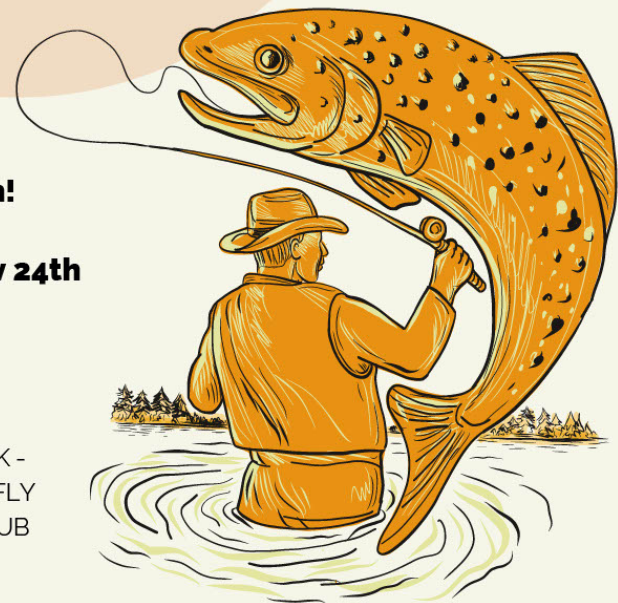

## Influenza and COVID-19 vaccines are available

The best protection against influenza and COVID-19 is vaccination!

It is safe to receive both vaccines at the same time!

Everyone 6 months and older can receive a vaccine!

COVID-19 vaccine available: Moderna

### LET'S KEEP OUR COMMUNITY SAFE AND HEALTHY

1. Wash your hands after coughing and before eating and touching your face
2. Stay home and isolate if you feel ill, and for 24 hours after feeling better. Once you are done isolating, wear a mask in public for 10 days after you started feeling ill.
3. Cough and sneeze into a tissue or into the bend of your arm
4. Get your influenza and COVID-19 vaccine!
5. Disinfect high touch surfaces often
6. COVID-19 RAT tests are available at Health Services

## RESPIRATORY ILLNESS INFORMATION

If you feel sick, please self-isolate until your symptoms are improving (and fever-free) for 24 hours. If you have gastrointestinal symptoms (nausea, diarrhea, abdominal pain), please self-isolate until your symptoms are improving for 48 hours and you are fever-free. Afterwards for 10 days after the symptoms started, please wear a mask in public and refrain from visiting those high-risk.

### SYMPTOMS could include:

- New or different from YOUR normal
- Fever, chills
  - Shortness of breath
  - Decrease or loss of taste or smell
  - Extreme tiredness
  - Muscle/joint pain
  - Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea
  - Sore throat
  - Runny nose or nasal congestion
  - Headache
  - Stomach pain
  - Pink eye
  - Decrease or loss of appetite

### Close contacts?

- For 10 days after contact, the close contacts should:
- Self-monitor for symptoms and self-isolate if symptoms develop
  - Wear a mask in public settings
  - Avoid visiting those at high-risk

### Seek emergency medical attention immediately if:

- Trouble breathing or shortness of breath
- Persistent pressure or pain in chest
- New confusion
- Inability to stay awake or wake up
- Pale, grey, or blue-coloured skin, lips, or nail beds

### Personal Protection

- Sanitize high touch areas in your home
- Wash & sanitize hands often
- Avoid touching your face
- Get the recommended vaccines
- Follow public health advice

### Testing?

- Tests are available at Health for those who would like one
- Results of your test may or may not change treatment or symptom management

COVID-19, flu, and colds have very similar symptoms, so it is important to self-isolate when feeling sick to prevent spread of ALL respiratory illnesses

## Centre for Valvular Heart Disease Mobile Screening Program

Available November 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at Pikwakanagan Health Services



**WHAT?** A free valvular heart disease and cardiovascular risk factor screening performed by a nurse, cardiac sonographer, and overseen by a cardiologist.



**WHY?** Valvular heart diseases are dysfunction of cardiac structures directing blood flow within the heart. Valvular heart disease is considered the next cardiovascular epidemic, affecting hundreds of thousands of people in Canada, yet it is often left undetected and undertreated. This program offers early detection and prevention of severe complications.



**HOW?** The sonographer will perform a mini ultrasound to look for valvular heart disease. The nurse will screen for cardiovascular risk factors through questions, measurements, and rapid finger poke blood tests. The cardiologist will review results and recommendations will be provided.



**WHO?** Anyone 65 years and older with no known cardiovascular history (heart problems).

- b) the qualified indigenous person; then to,
- c) the qualified non-indigenous candidate.

**Interviews:** Interviews will be conducted in-person or virtually by Teams Meeting. AOPFN has the right to shortlist for interview/assessment purposes of the five (5) most qualified persons and typically establishes an eligibility list.
