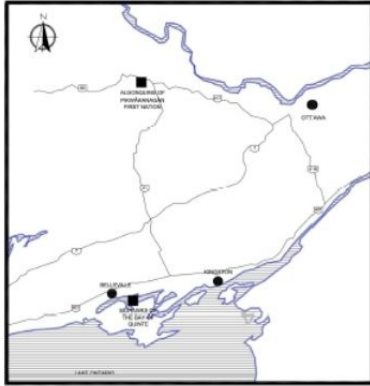

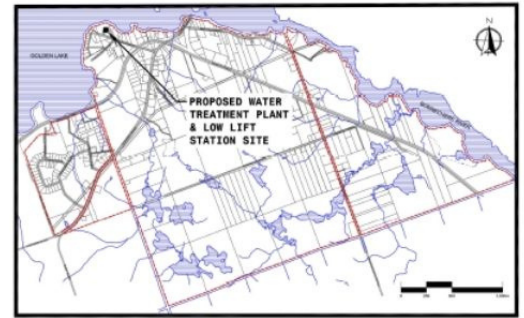

New Campus Development for The Ottawa Hospital – Employment and Apprenticeships

Dear Member,

The New Campus Development for The Ottawa Hospital been approved for construction, and will be anchored by a new 2.4 million square foot state-of-the-art hospital. Would you like to be involved in the building of this very important and major piece of infrastructure? It is a major project that is expected to take many years to complete and cost billions of dollars.

I have recently joined Graham Bird, and his team at GBA Group (GBA) in an active role as Advisor – Indigenous Engagement and Economic Development. GBA is a Development and Project Management Company located in Ottawa, and is a signator to The Ottawa Hospital (TOH) Project Labour Agreement (PLA) of November 2022. The PLA is also signed by the President and CEO of The Ottawa Hospital, the President of the Unionized Building and Construction Trades Council of Eastern Ontario and Western Quebec, and by 19 Locals of the various Trade Unions.

We are looking for interested Members of AOPFN who would like to be employed working on the new hospital and who are also interested in being Apprentices of a construction trade while doing so. I am prepared to discuss this with you and hope to be able to answer any questions you may have.

A number of the Union Locals who are signators to PLA have Apprenticeship Training Centres in Ottawa. Some of these are the Carpenters, the Bricklayers and Allied Crafts, the Ironworkers and Rodmen (Metcalf), the Electricians, the Plumbers and Pipefitters, etc.

The Union, the Union Locals, the Provincial Government (Infrastructure Ontario) and the Ottawa Hospital are actively encouraging Indigenous people to be employed and to be trained as Apprentices while working on this project and have incorporated this into the Project Agreement as part of the Indigenous Procurement Strategy and as part of the process of Reconciliation.

There are 144 recognized skilled trades in Ontario and many of these will be involved in the construction of the new Hospital. The Union Locals are actively seeking Apprentices as there are many construction projects going on, and especially Indigenous Apprentices for the new Hospital.

I have toured 4 of the Locals Training Centres and have met with Representatives of those Locals where I asked questions and was provided with a lot of helpful information about how Unions work, what is involved in becoming an Apprentice and how long does it take to complete your Apprenticeship in a specific trade, etc.



Once accepted for a particular trade as an Apprentice, it can take from 2 to 5 years to complete the apprenticeship depending on the trade you have selected. One important thing to know is that you get paid while working as an Apprentice and the necessary training and formal education you go through at the Training Centres to complete your Apprenticeship is free or covered by grants. In addition to this, your rate of pay increases each year in the Apprenticeship program.

For example, a 1st term Interior Systems Carpenter Apprentice with Local 2041 would be paid (as of May 7, 2023) \$23.51/hour along with benefits such as Vacation Pay and Health Benefits. After your 1st year, contributions are also made into a Pension fund by your employer, and you receive scheduled pay increases as you progress through your Apprenticeship. By the 5th term of your Apprenticeship (approximately 3 years of full-time work and 2 levels of Apprenticeship training) you get paid \$36.33/hour plus benefits and pension.

Once you complete your Apprenticeship program you become a Journeyperson and the starting rate of pay (as of May 1, 2023) is \$42.24/hour while on a Union job (like the new Ottawa Hospital construction project) plus benefits (i.e. vacation pay, pension, health and welfare) for a total of \$60.10/hour.

If you are interested in a different trade besides Carpentry, we can get you the same type of information for that Trade.

If you are interested, we can help you by providing you with information, by answering or getting the answers to any questions you may have. We can assist you in becoming enrolled in an apprenticeship program and help you get into the Apprenticeship system, and be with you every step of the way.

I have met with and discussed the Hospital project and Apprenticeships with the Manager of Education, the Manager of Economic Development, and the Manager of AOPFN LP.

Centre for Valvular Heart Disease Mobile Screening Program

Available November 7th and 8th, 2023 at Pikwakanagan Health Services



WHAT? A free valvular heart disease and cardiovascular risk factor screening performed by a nurse, cardiac sonographer, and overseen by a cardiologist.



WHY? Valvular heart diseases are dysfunction of cardiac structures directing blood flow within the heart. Valvular heart disease is considered the next cardiovascular epidemic, affecting hundreds of thousands of people in Canada, yet it is often left undetected and undertreated. This program offers early detection and prevention of severe complications.



HOW? The sonographer will perform a mini ultrasound to look for valvular heart disease. The nurse will screen for cardiovascular risk factors through questions, measurements, and rapid finger poke blood tests. The cardiologist will review results and recommendations will be provided.



WHO? Anyone 65 years and older with no known cardiovascular history (heart problems).

Exterior:

1. Remove the existing chimney and properly insulate, vapor barriers and cladding over the existing hole from chimney. Patch and repair roof where chimney protrudes, install metal roof covering and soffits in this area.
2. Install spindles on the front deck and repair any necessary boards/steps.

Interior:

3. Install a new range hood above the kitchen range. The range shall be capable of 200 c.f.m with a sound rating not more than 1.5 sones in the kitchen. Fan to be CSA and HVI certified. The range shall be vented directly to the exterior with non combustibile ducting and material. Where the ducting passes through unheated space it shall be insulated.
4. Install proper sump pit and pump that is sealed and vented to the outdoors.
5. Add basement interior wall insulation. Ensure that insulation be installed complete with vapour barrier (to maintain building envelope) to minimum levels of the Ontario Building code along interior sides of foundation wall; this includes all header spaces, with a framed wall to ensure protection from damage and to meet the requirements of Ontario Building Code 9.10.17.10. Ensure drywalled basement walls have receptacles as per the electrical code.
6. Remove the bottom four layers or so of vinyl siding to inspect the sheathing in these areas. If rotted, replace all rotted sheathing as need be, caulk and seal all joints at the rim board and corners to prevent air leakage into the interiors at the floor wall intersection. Re-install air barriers and siding.
7. Touch up all wall nicks and damages, plaster prime and paint walls and ceilings.

All work to meet or exceed the current Ontario Building Code, ESA, and TSSA requirements.
