Exterior:

- 1. Replace the siding on the entire unit and add 1-inch insulation.
- 2. Removal of chimney and disposal of it once propane furnace is installed. Ensure that the roof and soffit will be patched.
- 3. Front landing staircase to be repaired to meet OBC. (6x6 posts)
- 4. Two Exterior doors to be replaced.

Interior:

- 1. Sand, prime, and paint all finishes as need be (2 coats of Primer and 1 Finish).
- 2. Frame and insulate basement, plumbing and electrical to be extended to meet the OBC.
- 3. Install water resistant flooring throughout the unit, including under the toilet.
- 4. Fix/renovate backyard roof leading to the basement to reduce the chance of head injury as per Part 9 of the OBC.
- 5. Install all new kitchen, fixtures, cabinetry (medicine cabinet for bathroom too) and finishes throughout the unit as needed.


