

# **Chief & Council Update**

The Algonquins of Pikwakanagan Chief Greg Sarazin and Council would like to provide an update to members regarding the \$77.9 million water treatment plant construction project.

Chief and council understand the hardships when it comes to any construction project that is undertaken. However, council is committed to providing the best services possible for residents. The project which got underway earlier this is year, is still on track to be completed by this time in 2025 and once complete, will provide clean water to roughly 200 homes and community buildings.

Chief and Council recognize the traffic delays have caused problems for both residents and visitors alike. Luckily, area roads can be repaved once the warm weather returns next summer. In the meantime, work will be done to make sure local roads will be open and safe to users during the winter months.

At this time, work will continue until the seasonal freeze arrives and will pick up again in the spring. Once the underground work is complete, Public Works will be working towards having all Pikwakanagan roads repayed with full shoulder width for community safety.

In his speech, Chief Greg Sarazin noted that First Nations people have been part of Canada's military history for over 200 years. In addition to that, over 12,000 Indigenous people have volunteered their services to the front lines, serving in all conflicts that Canada has been involved in.

Monday's service also included performances by the youth drumming group and a gathering at the Makwa Centre afterwards.

#### Community Debrief: LT1 Projects Update

November 2, 2024

Dear AOPFN Members,

Below is a comprehensive update on the community meeting held Saturday, November 2nd, 2024. AOPFN announced exciting developments regarding our new LT1 Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) projects. These initiatives promise to bring significant economic and environmental benefits to our community over the next few decades.

What Are the LT1 Projects? - The LT1 projects consist of five BESS initiatives that AOPFN will partner in, following our successful bids through the Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO). They are set to provide a stable source of revenue for our community for the next 20 years.

What is a BESS Project? - BESS projects are battery facilities that store electricity from the grid during off-peak hours (when demand and costs are low) and sell it back during peak hours (when demand and prices are high).

#### Why Are BESS Projects Important?

- Energy Reliability: They ensure stable power supply during peak demand and help reduce power outages.
- Economic Benefits: They lower energy costs for consumers and generate revenue for our community.
- Environmental Stewardship: They integrate renewable energy sources and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

#### AOPFN's Success in the LT1 Bidding Process

We are proud to announce that AOPFN was awarded five out of the ten available contracts for BESS projects in the LT1 bidding process—a remarkable achievement! Only three First Nations in the province received contracts, and we secured the largest number of any bidder.

#### Details of the Five BESS Projects

- 1. Skyview2 BESS (Potentia Renewables) Capacity 412MW
  - o Location: South of Ottawa
  - AOPFN's Share: 10% equity ownership and royalty payments over the 22-year contract, plus a 10% share of the profits.
- 2. Fitzroy BESS (Brookfield Renewable Power/Evolugen) Capacity 250MW
  - Location: South of Fitzroy Harbour
  - AOPFN's Share: 50% ownership with a guaranteed minimum payment over the 22-year contract.
- 3. Trailroad BESS (Brookfield Renewable Power/Evolugen) Capacity 150MW

- Location: West of Highway 416, southeast of Ottawa
- AOPFN's Share: 50% ownership with a guaranteed minimum payment over the 22-year contract.

#### 4. Almonte BESS (Compass Solar) - Capacity 9.9MW

- o Location: Near Almonte
- AOPFN's Share: 51% ownership with a "service fee" ensuring financial benefit even if the project is not immediately profitable.

#### 5. North Glengarry BESS (Compass Solar) - Capacity 16.3MW

- o Location: East of Ottawa, south of Montebello, Quebec
- AOPFN's Share: 51% ownership with "service fee" ensuring financial benefit even if the project is not immediately profitable.

#### **Financing Structure for LT1 Projects:**

- Senior Loans: Will cover 80% of the project costs.
- Aboriginal Loan Guarantee Program (ALGP): Provides loan guarantees from the Province of Ontario for loans taken by First Nations for energy projects, lowering interest rates and eliminating financial risk for AOPFN.
- Partnership Loans: Available from our project partners if needed, though we aim to secure the most favorable interest rates elsewhere.

#### **Key Takeaways**

- Long-Term Prosperity: The LT1 BESS projects represent a significant opportunity to generate long-term revenue, creating a legacy of prosperity for future generations.
- **Risk Mitigation:** Projects are structured to minimize risk and ensure positive returns through guarantees, partnerships, and careful financial planning.
- Community Commitment: AOPFN is dedicated to addressing concerns and ensuring projects are developed safely, responsibly, and sustainably.

#### **Next Steps**

- Ongoing Engagement: We continue to update and involve the community, gathering feedback as the projects progress.
- Securing Financing: Efforts to secure financing through the ALGP and other sources are underway.
- Revenue Management Discussions: The Chief and Council, along with the LP Board of Directors, are working on a plan for revenue management and distribution.



ORAL CANCER SCREENING CLINIC **November is Oral Cancer Awareness Month! Risk Factors:** Tobacco use is the main cause of mouth cancer. Drinking alcohol to excess can increase risks four fold. Drinkers and smokers are 30 times more likely to develop mouth cancer. Poor diet and social deprivation is linked to a third

of all cancer cases.

The Human Papilloma Virus (HPV), transmitted through oral sex, could overtake tobacco and alcohol as the main risk factor within the next decade. Exposure to the sun is a cause of skin cancer which can affect the lips and face.

# Tupe 1 Diabetes Diabetes

- · Autoimmune disease
- People with type 1 diabetes aren't able to produce their own insulin
- Type 1 diabetes generally develops in childhood or adolescence but can also develop in adulthood
- People with type 1 need to inject insulin or use an insulin pump to ensure their bodies have the right amount of insulin.

#### Signs and Symptoms

The most common signs and symptoms of type 2 diabetes can include the following:

- · unusual thirst
- · frequent urination
- weight change (gain or loss)
- · extreme fatigue or lack of energy
- · blurred vision
- · frequent or recurring infections
- · cuts and bruises that are slow to heal
- · tingling or numbness in the hands or feet
- · trouble getting or maintaining an erection
- · diabetes ketoacidosis (DKA)

#### Type 2 Diabetes

- People with type 2 diabetes can't properly use the insulin made by their bodies, or their bodies aren't able to produce enough insulin
- Type 2 diabetes is most commonly developed in adulthood, although it can also occur in childhood.
- Type 2 diabetes can sometimes be managed with healthy eating and regular exercise alone, but may also require medications or insulin therapy.





# PROTECT YOUR LUNGS

Lung cancer remains the most commonly diagnosed cancer in Canada, and the most common cause of cancer deaths.

#### **RISK FACTORS**



Smoking tobacco, second-hand smoke, radon, asbestos, family history, radiation and air pollution.

#### SIGNS & SYMPTOMS



Pain in chest, shoulder, back or arms, frequent lung infections, a new cough that doesn't subside or worsens over time, fatigue, shortness of breath, hoarseness, loss of appetite or weight loss, whistling sound when breathing, swelling in the neck or face, blood clots, and dizziness or weakness.

#### **SCREENING**



If you are 55 to 74 years old and have smoked cigarettes every day for at least 20 years (not necessarily 20 years in a row) - you may be eligible for lung cancer screening.

#### IF YOU ARE CONCERNED ABOUT YOUR RISK, TALK TO YOUR DOCTOR.

Prevention of lung cancer is key. Often times lung cancer is not diagnosed until the cancer has spread.



#### RADON GAS CAUSES LUNG CANCER



Lung cancer is the most common cancer in Canada and has a low survival rate. Long-term exposure to radon is the #1 cause of lung cancer for non-smokers.

Too many non-smokers do not think they are at risk of developing lung cancer.


