Chief and Council Update – March 28th, 2025

In the new, 2025 Post- Secondary Education policy for the Algonquins of Pikwakanagan, Chief and Council was able to include and put an important highlight on two key fields of study for students attending post secondary education this year.

New in 2025, AOPFN Chief and Council have included sponsorships for Masters and Doctorate Degrees. Council worked tirelessly to make sure this was available to students and to secure the need for the additional financial assistance. The addition of these programs falls in line with other programs sponsored by AOPFN, which include skilled trades, fast tracked programs, co-ops and internships, and spring/summer terms if mandatory.

The new **Post-Secondary Education Student Support Program Policy and Procedures (2025)** will guide student intake, determine eligibility, and set limits on costs not covered by the tuition waiver, such as ancillary fees, administrative fees, books, materials, supplies, living allowances, and residency fees.

The deadlines to apply include May 1st for sponsorship applications, May 15th for new student applications and high school graduates looking to defer sponsorships until next year.

Community Update #2 Regarding the Near Surface Disposal Facility (NSDF) in Chalk River

Kebaowek First Nation (KFN), Concerned Citizens of Renfrew County (CCRC),
Canadian Coalition for Nuclear Responsibility (CCNR) and Sierra Club Canada (SCC)
vs. Attorney General of Canada and Canadian Nuclear Laboratories (CNL)

[Kebaowek First Nation v. Canada \(Attorney General\) - Federal Court](#)

Background:

- To address waste management needs, Canadian Nuclear Laboratories proposed construction of a Near Surface Disposal Facility (NSDF) for proper storage of legacy and new low-level waste at the Chalk River Laboratories (CRL) in Chalk River, ON.
- A **Judicial Review** was submitted by: KFN, CCRC, CCNR and SCC. Their joint position was that the Minister of Environment and Climate Change Canada's (ECCC) decision to grant the permit is unreasonable, as existing measures inadequately protect endangered or threatened species at the Chalk River Site. The proposed NSDF facility will be located near the critical habitats of three species listed under schedule 1 of the **Species At Risk Act** (SARA): the threatened Blanding's Turtle, the endangered Little Brown Myotis (bats), and the endangered Northern Myotis.
- The Federal Court released their decision on March 14, 2025. The SARA permit was set aside and the ECCC was requested to reconsider the issuing of the SARA permit, and also the location of the NSDF at CRL, to consider alternative locations with fewer impacts on wildlife or that are less harmful to species at risk.

CNL Response to AOPFN, as per the LTRA:

- The LTRA is a Long Term Relationship Agreement that was signed in May 2023 between AOPFN, CNL and AECL to ensure proper engagement on all projects within the AOPFN unceded and un-surrendered traditional territory.
- CNL states that they respect the decision rendered by the Court and that currently, the historic low-level waste at Chalk River Laboratories remains in temporary storage, where it is routinely monitored.

Closing:

- AOPFN does not, and never has, claimed to speak for all Algonquins on this or any other matter and that we respect the rights of other Algonquin nations, Canada's duty to consult, and Canada's responsibility to uphold the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP) and Indigenous Rights to free, prior, and informed consent.
- Protection of the lands, waters and wildlife is always our top concern. The AOPFN will continue to inform proponents in respect to our Consultation & Engagement Protocols & Requirements in relation to projects in AOPFN's unceded Algonquin traditional territory.

Dear Members,

This is a notice to advise that registered traplines are available for reallocation within all districts. Members with the applicable licenses (i.e., annual renewal and valid trappers license) and are interested in becoming a head trapper on one of the registered traplines available for reallocation (listed below) or traplines within the district, should connect with Algonquins of Pikwakanagan's Natural Resources Department for additional information.

Traplines Available:

4-year Temporary allocation – within the Algonquin Land Claim Settlement Area:
PE015, PE041, PE038, TW041

3-year Temporary allocation – within the Algonquin Land Claim Settlement Area:
PE009, PE020, PE048, TW031, MD025

Members can connect with Natural Resources to review trapline locations and maps.

Please note that currently, the Ministry of Natural Resources is not allocating traplines in the Algonquin Land Claim Settlement Area on a permanent basis. Traplines are available on a 3-year or 4-year temporary basis.

The process to allocate future permanent registered traplines will be completely independent of any temporary registered trapline assignments.

New trapline buildings will NOT be authorized or considered at this time within the Algonquin Land Claim Settlement area.

Applications are to be submitted to MNR not later than May 2nd, 2025.

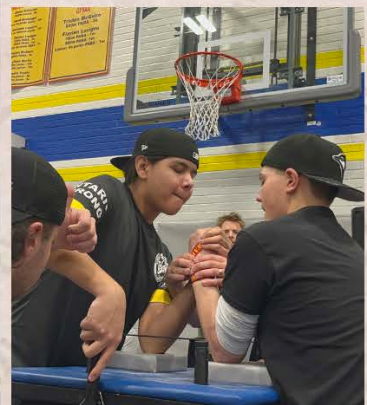

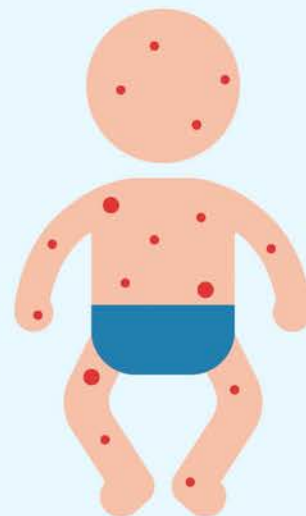
MEASLES

NOT JUST A DISEASE FROM THE PAST

- Cases of measles have been reported in Ontario
- Measles is very contagious, it infects 90% of close contacts who are not immune
- Measles virus can live in the air and on surfaces for 2 hours
- Measles can cause serious health complications and death

SIGNS & SYMPTOMS

- High fever
- Cough
- Runny nose
- Red, watery eyes
- Small, white spots inside the mouth
- Rash starting 3-5 days after symptoms begin

Janitorial Services – Unit 3 – 469 Kokomis Inamo, Pikwakanagan

Cleaning services are to be provided after 4:30 pm and before 7:30 am. Cleaning supplies will be provided. Advise EA when supplies are needed. Winter and Spring months will require additional cleaning, including boot trays.

Winter: Will require **DAILY** shoveling and sanding/salting of front and back entrance ways. Sand and salt will be provided.

Front Entrance, Unlocked Offices, Boardroom Area:

Wipe all light switches and door handles

Dust all surfaces, spot wiping as necessary

Scrub/mop, sweep/vacuum floors/rugs

Clean the front door & windows as needed

Kitchen Area:

Wipe all light switches, fridge door handle and inside of fridge

Clean countertop

Scrub/mop, sweep/vacuum floor

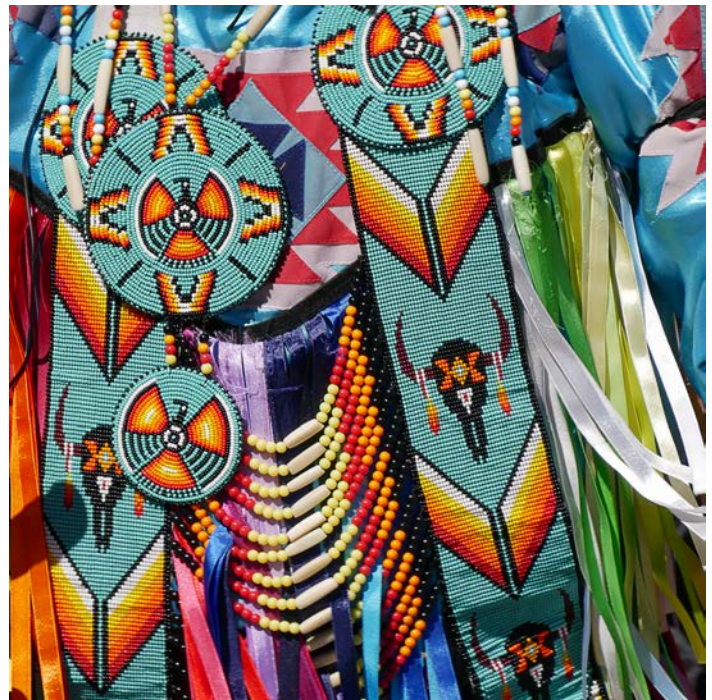
