TOTAL FIRE BAN

An extreme risk of forest and brush fires has escalated the response from local townships and their fire departments.

As the Ministry of Natural Resources warns that conditions across the Ottawa Valley are dangerously hot and dry, communities in and around Renfrew, Arnprior, and Pembroke, as well as the rest of Renfrew County, are now under total or partial fire bans.

Total fire bans restrict most types of open-air burning, including campfires, brush burning, burn barrels, incinerators, and fireworks.

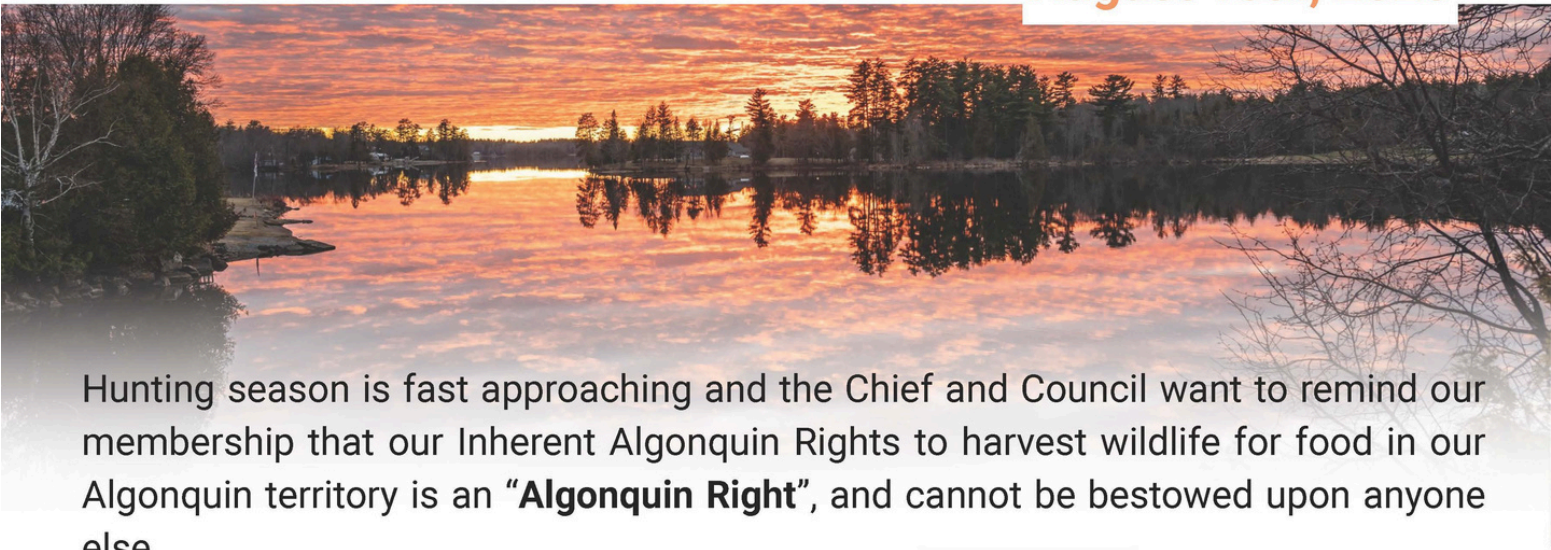
Anyone caught starting a fire while under a ban could be liable for any firefighting costs involved should the fire get out of control.

Residents in the affected area can still use CSA-approved propane and natural gas appliances, like barbeques and camp stoves, but fire chiefs across Renfrew County are asking for them to be used with caution.



CHIEF & COUNCIL UPDATE

August 15th, 2025



Hunting season is fast approaching and the Chief and Council want to remind our membership that our Inherent Algonquin Rights to harvest wildlife for food in our Algonquin territory is an “**Algonquin Right**”, and cannot be bestowed upon anyone else.

Only Algonquins can exercise Algonquin Rights and as members of the Algonquins of Pikwakanagan First Nation, we each have the responsibility to protect our AOPFN Rights.

A “Code of Conduct” was established years ago to provide guidance on how we could exercise our inherent Rights in a manner that would help protect those Rights and help us to avoid confrontations with MNR. A copy of the Code of Conduct and a harvest map, can be picked up from the AOPFN Natural Resources Department at the Admin Office or at algonquinsopikwanagan.com/harvest.

Please remember to always carry your status card when harvesting.

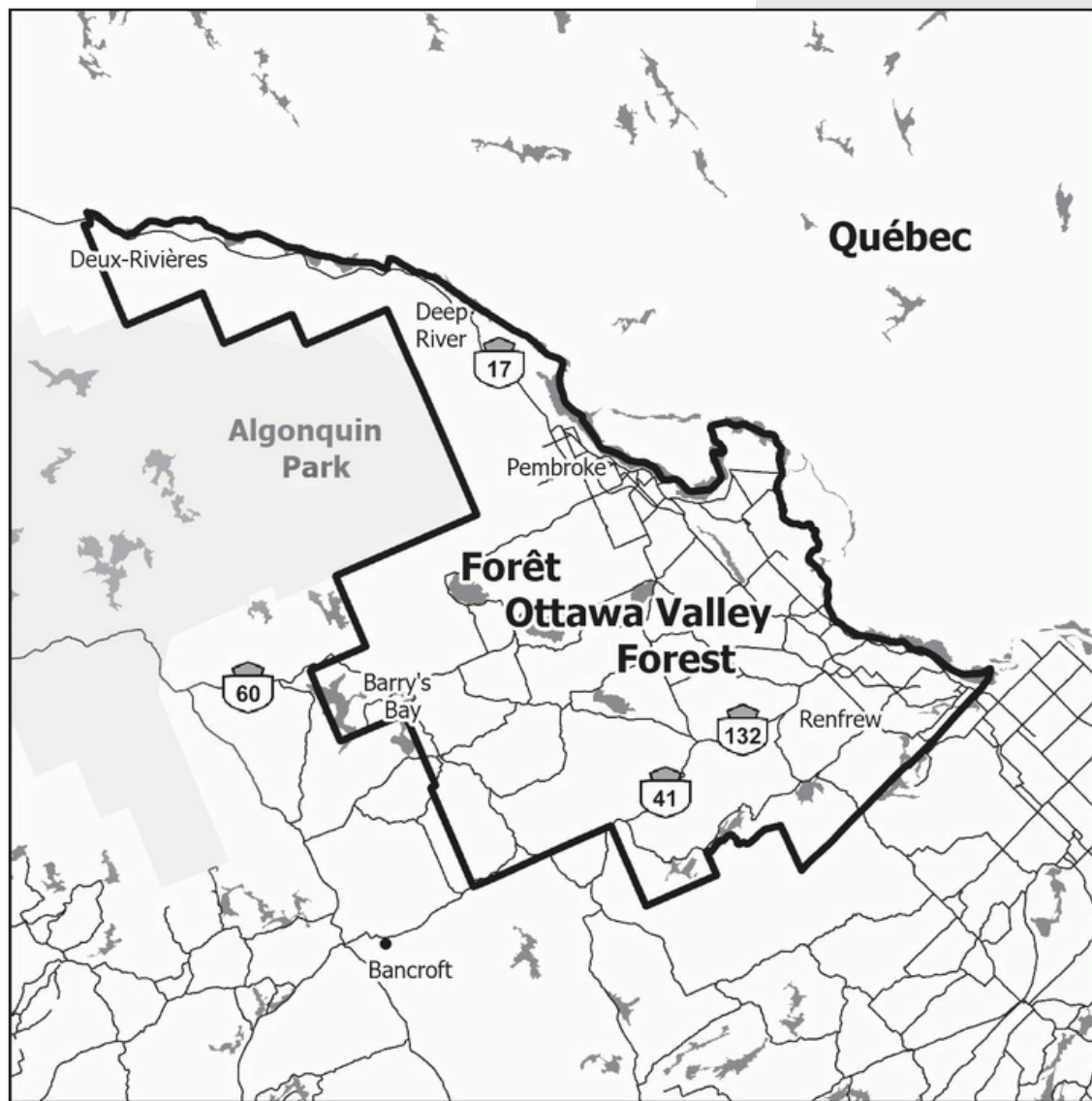
We ask all hunters to remember that this land is more than a hunting ground—it is the home of our ancestors, the source of our sustenance, and the heart of our culture. Hunting should always be carried out with respect, humility, and gratitude. Gratitude to the Creator and gratitude to our ancestors for protecting our Algonquin Rights for their future generations, us; and now it is our responsibility to protect our inherent Algonquin Rights for our future generations.

Inspection of Herbicide Project for Ottawa Valley Forest

The Ontario **Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR)** invites you to inspect the planned herbicide project for the 2025 season. As part of our ongoing efforts to regenerate and protect Ontario's forests, selected stands on the **Ottawa Valley Forest** (see map) will be sprayed with herbicide to control competing vegetation, starting on or about: **September 1, 2025**.



The project description and project plan for the herbicide project is available electronically for inspection by contacting the **Ottawa Valley Forest Inc.** during normal business hours and on the Natural Resources Information Portal at <https://nrip.mnr.gov.on.ca/s/fmp-online> beginning **July 31, 2025** until **March 31, 2026** when the Annual Work Schedule expires.

Estelle Amikons

After 32 years of dedicated service, Estelle Amikons has closed a remarkable chapter in her life by retiring from her role as Librarian with Algonquins of Pikwakanagan First Nation, effective July 31st, 2025.

Estelle's journey began in 1994, when she stepped into the library at a time when few others were willing to take on the role. What might have seemed a quiet, humble beginning soon blossomed into a legacy defined by unwavering commitment, deep compassion, and meaningful connection.

Over the decades, Estelle became more than just a librarian; she became a familiar and welcoming presence to generations of community members. Among her proudest accomplishments was the privilege of working with children, watching them grow from curious visitors into confident, contributing members of Pikwakanagan. For many, their early visits to the library are warm memories, shaped by Estelle's kind encouragement and steady guidance.

Her work extended beyond the walls of the library. Through the Education Department, Estelle played a vital role in supporting literacy initiatives and cultural learning programs. Collaborating closely with teachers, education staff, and families, she helped build a strong foundation for lifelong learning in the community. Together with the other pillars of Education, the late Andrew Lavalley, the late Gloria Bernard, Judy Ellis, Della Meness, and Teresa G. Kohoko, Estelle nurtured a space where youth could thrive academically and personally, feeling supported every step of the way.

One milestone stood out as especially meaningful to Estelle: Celebrating 55 years of continuous operation, making the library as the oldest First Nation Library in Ontario. Over the years, Estelle welcomed countless dignitaries and government officials, always representing Pikwakanagan with grace, pride, and humility.

When asked what legacy she hoped to leave, Estelle's answer was pure as a clear spring: *"Just me."* Indeed, it is her enduring presence, kind-hearted, steadfast, and true, that will forever ripple through the hearts of many and the community.

On August 14th, 2025, staff and community gathered to honour Estelle, filling the afternoon with laughter, stories, and gratitude. It was a celebration not just of her career, but of a life spent lifting others, page by page, moment by moment.

As she steps into the calm embrace of retirement, we honor Estelle's extraordinary journey and wish her peace, joy, and fulfillment in the unwritten chapters ahead.

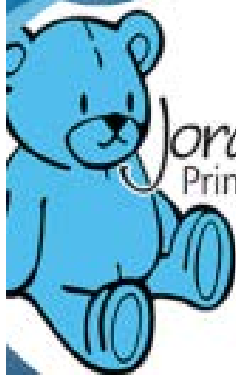

Marion has been involved working within a community setting throughout her career. Her focus has been in areas of health, management, business development, sales, coaching, training, communications, and charity work.

In 2007 Marion became involved with fundraising for the University of Ottawa Heart Institute Foundation and served as co-chair to a charity fund raising event. This was an all female golf charity tournament raising awareness of heart disease in women and raised over \$1,000,000 for the Canadian Women's Heart Health Centre(CWHHC) at the University of Ottawa Heart Institute.

Marion herself is a Heart Patient Survivor. In 2008 Marion was diagnosed with Complete Heart Block requiring a Permanent Pacemaker. Thanks to the Heart Institute and all the staff for their great care. She feels great today.

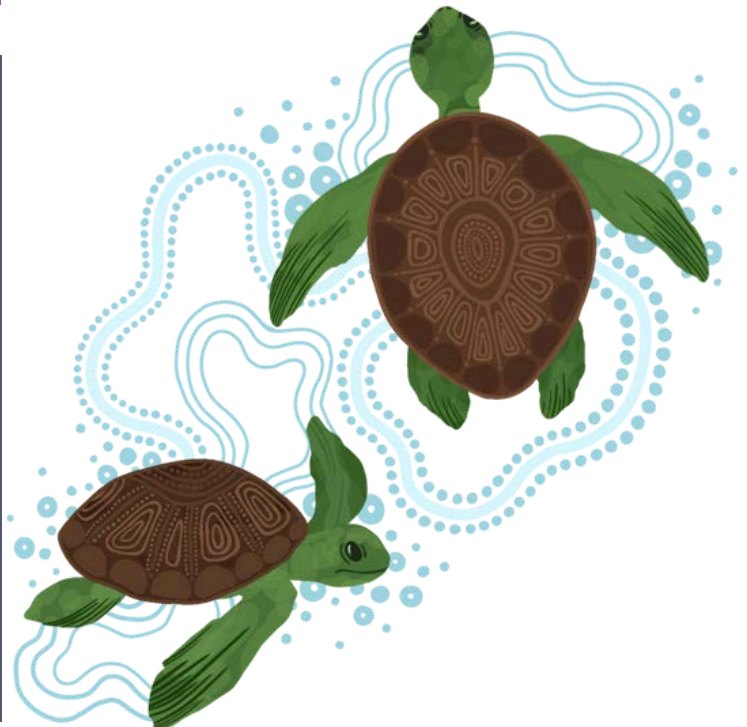
