Lest we Forget

CHIEF & COUNCIL UPDATE

November 7th, 2025

First Nations have recently won yet another lawsuit against the Government of Canda for past harms. In June of 2022, Pikwakanagan was one of 325 First Nations across Canada that "opted in" to the Band Reparations Class Action lawsuit against Canada.

The lawsuit is about the collective harm suffered by Indigenous communities as a group because of Indian Residential Schools. The lawsuit says that the Government of Canada is responsible for damages to Indigenous communities caused by the Indian Residential School system, and in particular, the collective harm suffered by Indigenous Communities due to the loss of language and culture because of Indian Residential Schools.

As a result of the settlement, the government of Canada will make a payment of \$2.8 billion (to a Trust/Not-For-Profit Four Pillars Society) to fully and finally resolve the Band Reparations Class Action. The Four Pillars are: Revival and protection of Indigenous languages, Revival and protection of Indigenous cultures, Wellness for Indigenous Communities and their members, Promotion and protection of heritage.

As a result of being part of the lawsuit, Pikwakanagan will receive a portion of the funds over the next ten years which must be expended according to the identified criteria, (Four Pillars).

We have now completed the required documentation and Chief Greg Sarazin and Council have recently signed the Band Council Resolution that supports the allocation of the funds.





How I Can Help

What Is Jordan's Principle?

Jordan's Principle ensures First Nations children 0-17 can access public services when they need them. Requests must be linked to a health, education, or social need and are reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Examples of Possible Supports

W Health Supports: Medical supplies, dental, and vision care

Education Supports: Psychological assessments, tutoring, assistive technology

Social Supports: Cultural activities, daily living needs (clothing, food, hygiene)

Mental Health Supports: Counseling, respite support, behavioral guidance

Specialized Equipment & Sensory Items: Weighted blankets, noise-cancelling headphones

Therapy Supports: Occupational, physical, speech therapy
